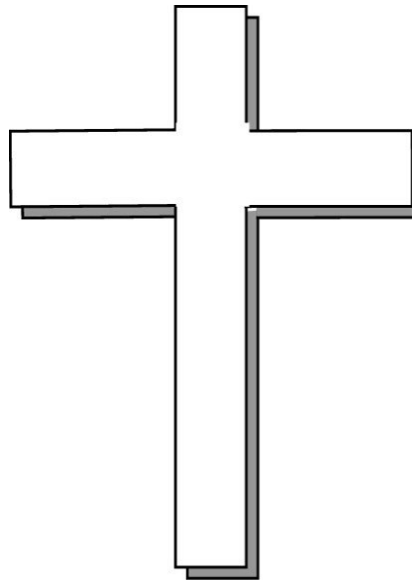

Rector's Letter

Dear friend

Joan and I spent a few days with our daughter Ruth, in Tramore Co Waterford a few weeks ago. When we were walking on the beach we noticed a white cross which has been erected in the sand dunes. The cross stands in the sunshine and the rain, in the calm and in the storm. It stands when the tide is in and when the tide is out. It stands in the changing seasons.

The cross, a symbol of God's amazing love, is there for all to see as they walk along the beach; and yet it is possible to be so engrossed with the view, with the waves or even in conversation that one walks past the cross without noticing it.

The same can be true in life, we can be so preoccupied with what we are doing or so engrossed in what is happening around us that we fail to 'notice' the cross. It's so easy to allow the cross and what it symbolises to fade into the background as we 'get on' with life. God, however, doesn't just want to be at the periphery of our lives, someone to whom we turn occasionally; he longs to be at the centre of our lives – involved in every aspect of our lives.

The cross declares and demonstrates God's great love for us and his desire for us to know him and have a relationship with him. He loves us in the calm and in the storm; he loves us in the challenges of life and in the changing seasons of life. He's interested in every aspect of our lives, if it's important to us, then it's important to him; if it's a concern to us then it's a concern for him. Take a moment to think about that - if it's important to us, then it's important to him; if it's a concern to us then it's a concern to him. Talk to God about whatever it is – ask God to minister into your life or into the situation by his Spirit bringing healing, hope, guidance, wisdom, courage, strength,

As we remember, or as we realise, what is important to us is important to God, what is a concern to us is a concern to God, please note that God's desire and longing is that what is important to him is also important to us, that what is a concern to him is also a concern for us.

As we settle into 'routines' after the summer, as we face fresh opportunities or fresh challenges, as we embark on another stage of the journey of life please remember if it's important to us, then it's important to God; if it's a concern to us then it's a concern for him, but also remember that God desires and longs that what is important to him is also important to us, that what is a concern to him is also a concern for us.

Talk to God; ask for his advice, his help. Listen to God; listen as you read his Word, listen as he prompts and speaks to you in various ways. Ask him to minister to you by the power of the Spirit. Ask him to minister to others through you in the power of the Spirit.

May we increasingly know the love of God and may our relationship with him grow and mature. May we know the peace of God and the presence of God, and may we know the power of God at work in us and through us.

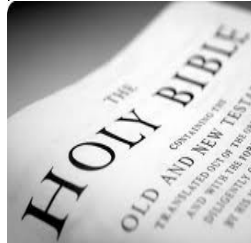

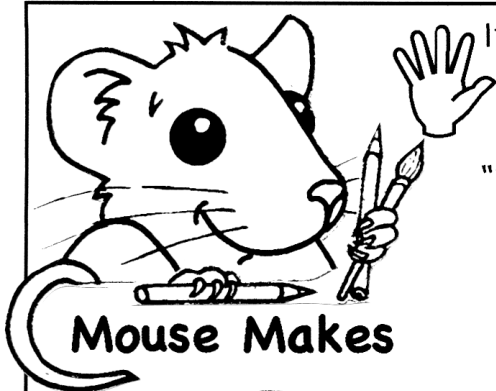

The Parish Centre was transformed into our very own Spy Ring and each day the children enjoyed action songs, drama, puppets, crafts, memory verses as they learned about Moses and his mission to rescue God's people from Egypt.

The week was rounded off on Sunday evening with a 'Mission:Rescue' Celebration Service when the Main Hall was filled to capacity. Over 300 children, parents, grandparents and friends enjoyed a lively and interactive celebration, a fitting conclusion to a great week!

The Holiday Club could not have taken place without such a tremendous and talented group of volunteers from the parish – over 60 dedicated workers! Thank you to all who helped with the planning, the preparations and with the delivery of the programme; thank you also to those who helped with cleaning and tidying up afterwards, not forgetting those who provided lunch on Friday and refreshments on Sunday evening. It has been wonderful working together as a team, God's people, just like the Israelites, inputting into the faith development of the children who attended.

1st Moira Scouts

Erecting the dining and store tents in the afternoon was difficult in the strong wind and lashing rain. Thankfully the rain stopped later on when we were putting up the accommodation tents.

Everyone arrived on site by 8.00pm on the Friday night and wood for the camp fire was gathered and the fire lit, which was of great benefit in helping to get rid of the swarms of mosquitoes.

As soon as darkness fell, which was quite late, there was the usual seek and evade games and eventually we all got into our sleeping bags at about 2:30am.

Unfortunately, some of the boys were up early Saturday morning, could it have been the light of the morning sun, or the thought of breakfast, or the morning chorus of the birds, or the possibility that the fire had gone out, or just the excitement of what was in store for the day, whatever it was it was only 4:45am!!

With breakfast over, the boys were split into two teams for the Saturday morning task of building a frame out of broom handles, to support a catapult which could fire water balloons. Both teams were successful in their construction and numerous balloons were fired, not all in the right direction and there were one or two misfires, but overall a very good effort by all.

Not such an early rise on Sunday morning, thank goodness, and following breakfast, the two teams set off for an orienteering/treasure hunt around the forest and lake. They had four points to locate and answer questions on. This was a timed event and all completed the course with the correct answers. Team one would have come first in a time of 1 hr 12 min, had they all finished together, but first place went to team two, who finished together in a time of 1 hr 21 minutes. Unfortunately, no treasure was found.

Lunch completed, the task of dismantling the camp started. Which incidentally was completed a lot quicker than the time it took to erect and all departed for home at about 2:30.

All-in-all, an enjoyable weekend for the boys, possibly a little tiring though.
